Call for papers

Submissions are invited under the theme of "Back to the Future". Short paper – a traditional presentation of 20 minutes with 5 minutes for questions.

Themed discussions – one hour discussion panels with a typical structure of 3 or 4 10-minute presentations on related topics followed by an open panel discussion.

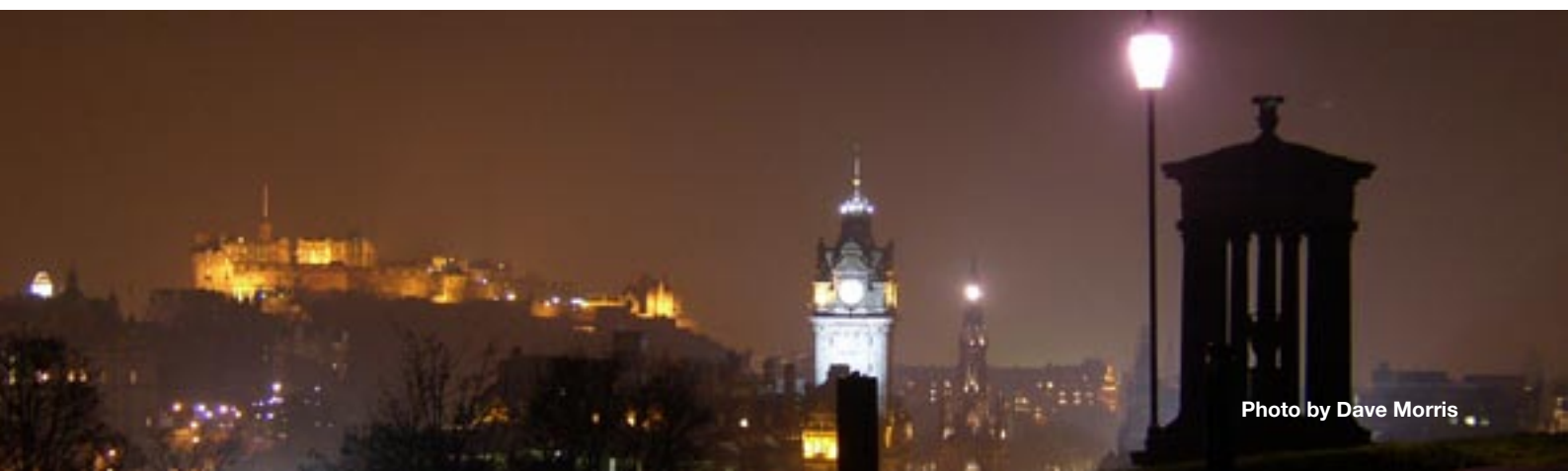
